# President's Report

2022 was an exciting year for Diving Queensland. The Organisation welcomed James to the role of CEO and established a competitions and administrative role for Toni Toohey. This new direction and investment will help us capitalise on the green and gold runway to 2032.

My first and foremost thanks for 2022 goes to our Clubs and to Diving Australia for supporting our vision and uniting with us to create a future for diving in Queensland that is inclusive, progressive, passionate and supportive.

Diving Queensland continues to lead the way in the delivery of domestic competitions thanks to the work of Toni, the competitions committee, Technical Officials and Volunteers. The Competitions Committee is regularly seeking feedback from our Coaches and Officials and are striving to further improve the landscape of our events.

For our divers, 2022 was an incredibly successful year. At the Australian Age and Masters Nationals we saw tremendous success with 11 Gold, 5 Silver and 10 Bronze medals earned by Queensland athletes. Of particular note, Zachary Picton won all 4 of his contested events while both Austin Hughes and Shumpei Komatsu earned 3 Gold medals each.


Queensland athletes earned similar success at the Australian Elite Junior Nationals and National Skills Final (NSF) in Sydney in July. There, 8 Queensland athletes competed in the NSF with Mila Klyne and Charli Brown the overall winners in their respective age groups. Six Queensland athletes contested the Elite Junior Championships and these athletes returned with 4 Gold, 4 Silver and 4 Bronze medals. Maggie Grey (Junior C) and Piper Howard (Junior D) were both awarded Australian Diver of the Year honours for their performances.

At the Australian Open National Championships, Queensland athletes won 2 Gold, 6 Silver and 2 Bronze medals. Cassiel Rousseau was crowned Australian National Champion in the Men's Platform and Domonic Bedggood and Cassiel were winners in the 10m Synchronised event.

Four Queensland athletes were selected to the Australian Team for the Commonwealth Games and FINA World Championships. These were Cassiel, Domonic, Emily Boyd and Georgia Sheehan. It was great to see these Queensland superstars shining on the world stage. Similarly, Sam Olivier rounded out a sensational year for Queensland diving when she won gold in the platform synchronised event at the FINA World Junior Championships.

A personal highlight for me was Australia hosting the Redbull Cliff Diving finals event in the Sydney Harbour where Rhiannon won her 10th World Series crown and Xantheia Pennisi finished 4th overall to secure a permanent position on the tour for next year.





In 2022, Diving Queensland continued to deliver our Diving for the Deaf program thanks to coaches Taneka Kovchenko, Emily Meaney and Caitlyn Bowell. This program is designed to make diving more accessible and is facilitated by the support of interpreters. Additionally, we also continued our Indigenous Diving Program with Hymba Yumba school. It is wonderful to be in a position where we can showcase our sport to more Queensland kids.

A big debt of gratitude also goes to our Brisbane High Performance Pillar coaches and support staff who always go above and beyond for the sport in Queensland. 2022 saw the team test hundreds of kids throughout Queensland on the hunt for future diving stars with the support of the QAS as part of the You for 32 campaign.

Congratulations and many thanks to our Board members who have continued to provide guidance and support. The Board, the subcommittees and the dedicated team of volunteers are the lifeblood of diving in Queensland. Without the significant contribution of all these people we would be unable to deliver the competitions and programs that we have in 2022.

Thanks also to our Patron, Mr Greg Vickery OA, who continued to support us with his kind words, and his presence at our competitions throughout the year. We look forward to another year with Greg's patronage. Thanks must also go to the Department of Tourism, Innovation and Sport and the QAS for their ongoing support of diving.

### **Communication**

In 2022 our new look Dive In newsletter was launched to highlight the work and achievements of our community. We have also focused on improved communication in 2022 through social media, our database, and emails to clubs and members directly. Our social media following, and engagement has significantly increased. We will continue to focus on improving communications in 2023.

### **Membership**

While our Membership runs separately to our Financial Year/the Calendar Year which makes our reporting complicated, our community continued to grow throughout 2022. Membership growth will be an important focus in 2023.

### **Officiating**

Thank you to all our Judges and Recording Secretariat officials for your continued attendance at State, National and International events, representing QLD and Australia. Stuart Graymore has provided invaluable support with officiating over many years, and we thank him for his contribution to the sport.

From the beginning of MY2022-23, Toni began running volunteer training for Clubs prior to competitions. In these sessions, volunteers would come in during the week and assist Toni to prepare for the events. This responsibility has continued to be shared amongst the Clubs and the assistance of the volunteers is greatly appreciated.

Paul Woods also significantly reduced the administrative load of preparing for competitions this year. Paul constructed a program that could automatically link competition registrations from our database to DiveRecorder which eliminated the need for this to be done manually. This has been an incredible help for our staff and is a service that has been highly sort after by the other states around the country as well. Thank you Paul for this incredible contribution.

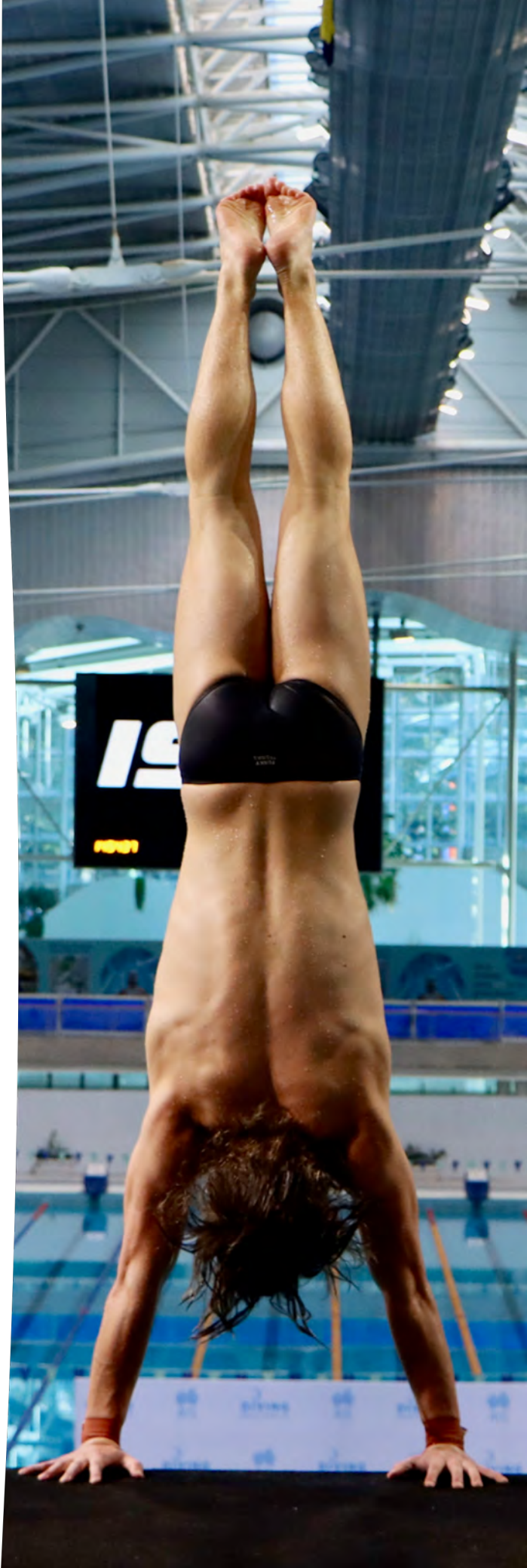

An important note for our level three and above judges to note is that it is important that you attend and judge at national events relevant to your level to improve your skills by judging a more diverse range of dives, and secondly to be evaluated by other experienced judges to receive valuable feedback from them. This will increase the opportunity of elevating your judging level.

Diving Australia's National Technical Diving Committee (NTDC) are monitoring the new officiating judging system and are continuing to update the relevant new policies. These policies have been ratified, and all current Diving Queensland judges should be aware of the changes and new requirements. Diving Queensland will devise and implement the required state workshop and include relevant information to you about the new officiating system.

I look forward to working with you all again.

# Coaching Report

## Level 1 Coaching

Diving Queensland hosted two Level 1 Coach Accreditation courses in 2022.

The courses in March (5) and October (12) were both very well attended with 17 prospective coaches beginning their coaching journey in Queensland.

Noting that the post-course requirements are rather extensive and that the delivery of workshops in 2021 was impacted by the pandemic, we look forward to continuing to support our coach candidates as they pursue their Level 1 accreditation in 2023.

DQ would, however, like to highlight and congratulate Nigel Dennis for successfully completing these requirements and gaining his Level 1 certification this year!





In 2022, our Level 1 Courses were facilitated by Vyninka Arlow (March), Chloe Kerr (March & October) and James Connor (October) and were made possible on the day thanks to the tireless work of Toni Toohey and the athletes who generously donated their time to be involved in the practical learning activities.

Thank you to all of these individuals for their significant contribution to furthering the development and recruitment of future coaches in Queensland.

### Level 2 Coaching

Diving Australia hosted two Level 2 Coaching Courses in 2022. These are facilitated by the DA Coaching Coordinator and are often held interstate subject to venue availability and demand.

In 2022, Diving Queensland gained 5 additional Level 2 Coaches with Toby Cobb, Chloe Kerr, Lucy Larkins, Xantheia Pennisi and Markus Perilla all successfully attaining their Level 2 accreditation.

# Notes to the financial statements

## For the year ended 31 December 2022

This financial report is a special purpose financial report prepared to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act Queensland 1981.

In the opinion of those charged with governance, the Association is not a reporting entity since there are unlikely financial statement users who cannot command the preparation of reports tailored to satisfy all their information needs.

The financial report has been prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historical costs, and does not consider changing money values or, except where expressly stated, current valuations of non-current assets.

The following material accounting policies, consistent with the previous period unless otherwise stated, have been adopted in preparing this financial report.

### **Income tax**

The association is exempt from income tax by Section 50 of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997. Accordingly, no liability is recognised.

### **Revenue recognition**

Revenue is recognised when it is probable that the economic benefit will flow to the Association and the revenue can be reliably measured. Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable.

Donations are recognised when the funds are deposited into a bank account or a merchant facility held by the Association.

Sponsorship is recognised when it is received or when the right to receive payment is established.

Revenue from recurrent grants is recognised upon receipt, and non-recurrent grants are recognised upon meeting the expenditure requirements specified in the agreements.

Other revenue is recognised when it is received or when the right to receive payment is established.

All revenue is stated gross of the amount of goods and services tax (GST).

### **Trade and other receivables**

Other receivables are recognised at amortised cost, less any provision for impairment.

### **Trade and other payables**

These amounts represent liabilities for goods and services provided to the Association before the end of the financial period, which is unpaid. Due to their short-term nature, they are measured at amortised cost and are not discounted. The amounts are unsecured and are usually paid within 30 days of recognition.

### **Goods and Services Tax**

The Association is not registered for goods and services tax. The amounts shown in the income statement include goods and services tax.

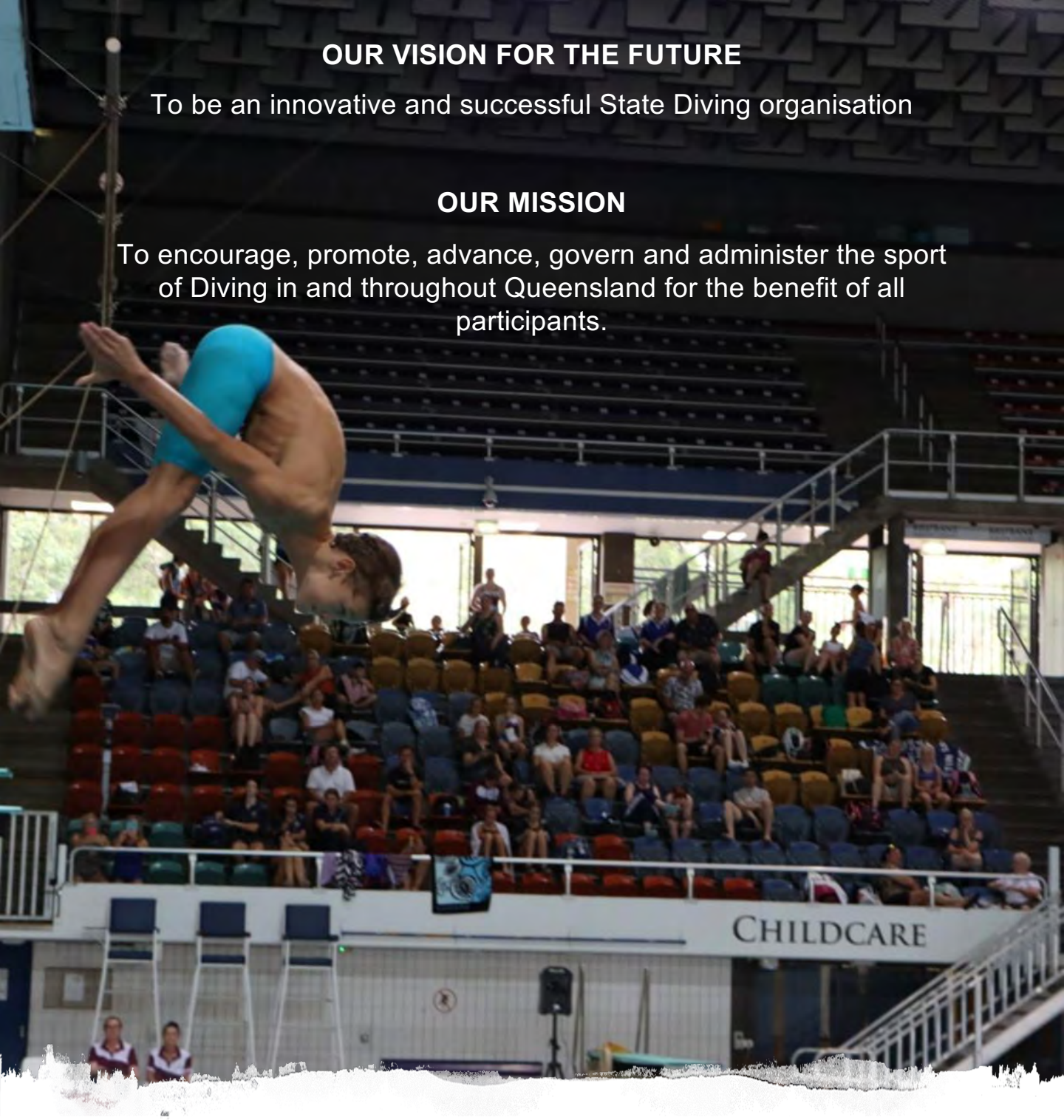
