Presidents Report

In 2019, Diving Queensland operated with no paid staff for a significant portion of the year after an unsuccessful probation period of the appointed administrator.

Congratulations and many thanks to my colleagues and fellow Board members who rallied around me to support the organisation through this difficult time. The many warm messages of support from around the country reminded me of the closeness of our diving community.

I would like to mention the significant voluntary contribution of the Board, and the commitment and dedication of our volunteers who make up our sub-committees. These include competitions, finance, technical, coaching, selection, as well as uniforms and school sport.

Thanks also to our Patron, Mr Greg Vickery OA, who continued to support us with his kind words, and his presence at our competitions throughout the year. We look forward to another year with Greg's patronage.

Coaching

Four QLD coaches attended a Level 2 Coach workshop in April. Two of the four have now been accredited with Diving Australia as Level 2 coaches. We look forward to watching the progression of these coaches. Congratulations.

A level 1 coach accreditation course was held in May with 5 candidates in attendance. Four are now actively coaching at club level. Well done to our new coaches. Many thanks also to Jenny Donnet for presenting the workshop.

Thanks also go to Tandi Hinchliffe for her continued support and assistance with coaching accreditations in Queensland.

Competitions

We congratulate the competitions committee on an outstanding year of competitions. Thanks to Stuart Graymore (Coordinator), Toni Toohey and Heidi Graymore for ensuring the smooth and

effective running of these events.

Media

We continued to increase notifications and event information to the wider community through social media, our database and emails to clubs and members directly. Social media trends are continually changing, and with this, Diving Queensland will embrace more social media platforms and different forums which will provide our brand with greater coverage in the community. We welcome news stories from all members and clubs.

Membership

Memberships remained on par from the previous year with a slight growth trend. Clubs purchased their own insurance for recreational divers in preference to Diving Queensland and Diving Australia insurance.

Officiating

A successful one-day combined judge's workshop and recording secretariat workshop was held in August. Kevin Hall and Stuart Graymore presented the judges workshop and updated participants on current rule changes. Judges are assessed at all competitions which includes feedback and mentoring. It is compulsory for judges to attend one workshop a year to maintain accreditation. This includes judges at club competitions who must be accredited Level 1 judges, having attended both a workshop and completed the judge's exam with a pass of 80% or higher.

Toni Toohey and Heidi Graymore presented the recording secretariat workshop, which teaches candidates about the duties involved with running our competitions such as manual recording and DiveRecorder software.

Thank you to all our judges and recording secretariat officials for your continued attendance at State, National and International events, representing QLD and Australia.

State Government

I would like to thank the Department of Sport and Recreation, in particular Kym Brandon, who continued to offer guidance and support through a difficult part of the year. We completed our 3rd and final year of the current funding cycle after submitting the final reporting. The new funding initiative, Activate! Queensland is a 10 year initiative (2019-2029) that commenced roll out with statewide community sessions targeted at all sporting groups in Queensland. Rollout and implementation of this initiative is somewhat uncertain in terms of requirements. For now, sports have 18 months of funding under variations to the current agreements (1/1/2020 – 30/6/2021).

The Office of Fair Trading has also been of great assistance in providing welcome support and advice, for which we are grateful.

It is most appropriate to also thank the Sleeman Sports Complex staff, in particular Tracey Galvin, who has been coordinating events for diving for many years. Tracey goes above and beyond to assist our community.

We look forward to enhancing our relationships with these key stakeholders in an ongoing effort to achieve excellence.

Congratulations

Congratulations were extended to all recipients of trophies at our Annual Awards lunch (listed further in the report). A fantastic sit-down BBQ style lunch was provided in the upstairs meeting room at the Gold Coast Aquatic Centre after the final qualifying competition for the year. Again, Diving Queensland fully subsidised this lunch for not only Diving Queensland members, but all accompanying family. Christmas goodie bags were also provided to divers and family members under 16. Many thanks again to the organisers and all volunteers who helped in some way on the day. It was lovely to see new faces volunteering. Thank you one and all. *"Volunteers are not paid, not because they are worthless, but because they are priceless."*

Please remember the value of those that

volunteer for the benefit of our divers and our sport.

We congratulate all our divers in QLD. No matter where you are on your diving journey, you do us proud on the stage on which you stand, be it locally, nationally or internationally.


Queensland was well represented at Age Nationals in Perth, Opens in Adelaide and Elite Juniors held here in Brisbane.

Technical Committee

I am pleased to report Queensland now has two level 6 judges, one level 5 and two level 4 judges. We have thirteen level 3, three level 2 and four level 1 judges. During the course of the Gold Coast Grand Prix in November 2019, five Queensland judges attended the Fina certification course and successfully completed the requirements. Congratulations to Heidi Graymore, Kevin Hall, Stuart Graymore, Rebecca Stafford and Caitlyn Bowell.

Whilst on certification please be reminded that when judging at any level of competition each judge must have successfully completed the state judging workshop and have at least a level 1 status.

Last year's judging workshop was a great success and we had many current and new judges attending. However, it is unfortunate that more of the newly qualified judges have not been active in pursuing the chance to shadow at DQ events to improve and progress their judging skills. It would be a great help to myself and the competitions committee if more judges could make themselves available for our DQ events to help out with the competitions. To level three and above judges it is important that you attend and judge at national events relevant to your level to improve your skills by judging a more diverse range of dives and secondly to be evaluated by other experienced judges to receive valuable feedback from them and third to increase your chances of elevating your judging level.

Diving Australia's National Technical Diving Committee (NTDC) are implementing a new officiating judging system and writing relevant new policies. Once these are ratified, all current DQ judges will be informed of the changes and new requirements. DQ will devise and implement the required state workshop and include relevant information to you about the new officiating system.

I will look forward to working with you all again once the current environmental challenge that faces us allows us to be together again. Until then stay safe and be happy.

Level 1

In May 2019, Queensland held a full day Level 1 Coach Accreditation Course. There were five candidates who had completed all necessary online course work and completed the practical workshop. Four out of the five are now actively coaching at club level. Congratulations go to Mark Teoh, Mackenzie Howell, Cassiel Rousseau, Toby Cobb and Catherine Ives who flew up from Melbourne to attend.

Diving Queensland would like to extend our gratitude and thanks to Jenny Donnet for taking the time to fly up from Melbourne to present this workshop, as well as Heidi Graymore for organising and coordinating the day. We also thank Taneka Kovchenko for doing a session on NTP coaching. Big thank you also to all our divers who made themselves available so our candidates could learn from you.

Level 2

Diving Australia held a level 2 Diving Coach Practical Workshop in Brisbane in April 2019. This, as well as an online component was completed. Following on from the 2 day workshop, practical coaching hours and online assessment activities are completed prior to upgrade. Four Queensland coaches attended the practical workshop, Taneka Kovchenko, Caitlyn Howell, Rebecca Stafford, and Erin Toohey. Congratulations to Taneka and Rebecca who have completed all the modules necessary and are now active Level 2 coaches.

International news

Rebecca Stafford accepted a role of Graduate Assistant Diving Coach at Penn State University in December 2019. As well as coaching, Bec is studying a Masters in Higher Education.

We wish Bec much success in the U.S. but look forward to her eventual return to coach in QLD again.

The competition ran from Sunday 28th July until Friday 2nd August at Aquanation in Ringwood, Melbourne.

There was a slightly different format at these championships with both team synchro and the knockout competition being run.

Everyone enjoyed these fun events and it was a nice way to end the championships.

The behavior of this team was fantastic. We had 13 students on the team for the first time. Everyone represented Queensland and their schools well. It was a great experience for our team members, and they all performed to the best of their ability.

Once again, we held a Queensland team dinner, including all parents, friends and family. It was a lovely night.



Recreational Diving

2019 saw a continuation of growth in participant numbers for our holiday programs from the previous year.

Most sessions were oversubscribed which enabled us to offer additional sessions to keep up with demand. We have many participants that attend multiple sessions during holidays. We will continue to offer this program at a heavily subsidised cost to participants in order to expose our sport to as many people as possible. During all Diving Queensland holiday sessions, club flyers are handed out to parents. So far, the conversion rate to club level has been minimal with only one or two divers signing up to a club.

We held programs during the Easter holidays, June school holidays and September school holidays.

Thanks to all the coaches that have assisted throughout 2019 with all these programs. We receive positive feedback about the running of our events.

Here is one of the wonderful messages about our program from the September/October sessions.

Diane M wrote on the 3RD Oct 2019: Thank you to all those responsible for organising and running the Dive Program and the BCC Chill out programme. My grandchildren had a great time - and have gained in confidence immensely from this initiative. The supervisors were actively involved in the safety aspects of the program and did a great job in encouraging the kids to stretch their limits in line with their abilities. I hope that this programme can be run again in the next school holidays as it received a big thumbs up from all of us.





During 2019, a program was developed as a standalone format, where all head coaches from all three clubs could nominate up to 4 divers each, to participate in a weekend trial program.

As a change from a one day clinic, an overnight stay was coordinated. All costs associated with the program was fully subsidised by Diving Queensland except for travel.

The new purpose for the QDDP is:

To identify a number of age divers that have the potential and work ethic to medal at Australian Age Titles, and to provide additional support and assistance to those athletes with a commitment to progress to a higher level of diving.

Additionally, the purpose for coaches is to provide the opportunity for continued professional development to enhance current coaching practices at club level.

In line with the new purpose of the QDDP, and after consultation with coaches and divers, we delivered a highly successful program. Ten divers aged 11 to 18 fully immersed themselves into the program, which included strength and conditioning discussion, dryland technique training, water training with technique corrections, an Aqua Zumba class, and a Sport Psychology workshop. After 5 hours at the pool, the divers were taken to the team accommodation where a short session on what judges look for, and videos of good dives v not so good dives and the scoring of those dives. The program was backed up by a return to the pool on Sunday morning to attend a DQ qualifying competition.

Coaches from each club were also invited to attend for the day which enabled them to see what divers were learning, so this could be transferred to club training.

There was a lot of positive feedback from divers, coaches and parents that various components of the program was significantly beneficial, especially the psychology session on competition nerves.

Our appreciation and thanks go to Diving Australia's Elite Pathway (Brisbane based) Program Coach, Vyninka Arlow for creating the dryland and water program, and talking to the divers on what the coaches requested. Vyninka made all the divers feel at ease throughout the day, and the divers were very keen to do their best for her.
