Despite the financial environment, and the very busy lives of our volunteers, we have successfully implemented a recreational diving programme in conjunction with Brisbane City Council with great success. This program will continue with BCC very happy with the results and the future vision of Diving Queensland.

Thanks to all for your efforts and commitment. There are a number of Board sub-committees that also involve significant involvement of other members, including Finance Committee, Technical Committee, Competitions Committee, Selection Panel, and Coaching Committee, and officers in the areas of Uniforms and Media.

COACHING

Level 1 Coaching Courses are being held throughout the year, and it is pleasing to see more coaches being accredited. This is always on-going, and any interest from any individual can always be registered with DQ.

OFFICIATING

A large number of volunteers continue to assist as judges, coaches, and recorders at Diving Queensland competitions, and new volunteers are always happily accepted. As new divers appear from recreational and Club efforts, new officials show interest in becoming officials and judges, and further training courses are planned for the coming year. The computerised recording program is used effectively by the volunteers, with results being readily available and transposed to the DQ web site for all participants to track their progress etc.

COMPETITIONS

Diving Queensland responds to the needs of the athletes by holding several Qualifying Competitions, State Championships and hosts on behalf of Diving Australia, National Championships (by roster). For the success of these competitions, it involves many people who volunteer their services as officials, judges, and coaches, and we are grateful to the small number of volunteers who assist in this area. We have now seen our second

successive year as invitees in the Queensland School Sport network with participation at the National Schools event in Sydney. Thanks to Heidi Graymore for an incredible effort in managing such a successful trip, and thanks to the Divers for their interest.

MEMBERSHIP

2011 saw a change in Club status within Queensland with the unfortunate decision of the Donnet family withdrawing their coaching expertise from the Queensland sporting environment. For whatever personal reasons they saw the need to windup the Donnet Diving Club at Kawana, but thanks to the efforts of Al and Di Smith of RAPS Diving, a presence, albeit small, still exists on the Sunshine Coast. We now have only three Clubs affiliated with Diving Queensland; RAPS based at Chandler (Brisbane), also their contingent at Kawana (Sunshine Coast), Paradise Diving based at Southport (Gold Coast), and Chandler Diving Club based at Chandler (Brisbane). DQ is working with RAPS to establish a Club entity again on the Sunshine Coast at a time in the near future. In addition we will in 2013 see the establishment of the new Centenary Dive Club at centenary Pool with the re-opening of that refurbished facility, thanks to the considerations of Brisbane City Council.

FACILITIES

The new outdoor deep-water pool has been completed at Brisbane Aquatic Centre - a long time coming but now the reality is upon us. Diving Boards, for 3 metre, 1 metre,

and 5 metre platform have been completed on the far side and these are now being booked for use by the Brisbane Clubs as the warmer months come upon us. This will allow Clubs to begin their training earlier, but of course like Southport and Kawana, they will need to learn how to manage outdoor facilities. DQ and the Clubs are fortunate to have access to good dry-land training facilities at Chandler in Brisbane. Brisbane City Council have made a commitment to re-open the diving facilities at Centenary Pool, Spring Hill, and funding has been allocated to achieve this within the new upgrade of those facilities due for completion mid-2013. Final contractual agreements are under consideration between BCC and the pool management company.

Having the AIS, QAS and a functional NTID Squad located at Chandler is of major benefit to our Club divers in many ways; however, the down side is that our Clubs have limited access at this time. Furthermore, the pool facility is often used for swimming competitions, which sometimes restricts availability over the summer months.

Further discussions have been entered into with the Queensland State Government regarding assistance with further re-establishment of facilities state wide, and at this point the research process of location of all those older facilities is under way.

MARKETING & PROMOTION

The Diving Queensland web site is a very useful tool, and we continue to look at other ways to promote that sport. We have incorporated Facebook, but as in all things of this nature, a volunteer to keep these products timely would be very useful. Our new online database, configured through IMG, has already opened new avenues of marketing and promotion within our member base, and will create a stronger state membership through direct communication to all financial and past members of Diving Queensland.

FUTURE PLANS

Our operational plan is continually under revision for submission for the next State Govt funding period. We

await advice for the period following this current cycle and what that will look like with the new Government in place. The Government focus is very much on increased participation and healthy lifestyles, but with the newly elected State Government now in place, a number of the State Government funding programmes may be altered to meet necessary budget considerations.

DQ will focus on:

- Increased Participation (eg through the recreational diving program),
- Retention in the sport of our teenage divers (eg by encouraging them to develop coaching and judging skills),
- Skill development of divers, coaches, and judges (through our squad programmes, coach training, and judging courses)
- Increased Profile (eg through marketing & media)
- Supporting Clubs to maintain viability (eg by supporting funding applications, negotiating pool access & costs, etc)
- Supporting Clubs with any marketing and promotional training that they may request from time to time.

CONCLUSION

The past year for Diving Queensland has been one of strong positive change, most, popularly supported by our members, and in my second year as President, I can only reiterate my thanks to all those who work so hard on behalf of Diving Queensland and for the betterment of the sport.

STATE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

Diving Queensland is working well within the confines of its mission and vision statements. The biggest concern over the past twelve months has been the drop off in membership. Diving does not seem to enjoy any spike following the Olympic Games, and couple that with the Sunshine Coast branch reduction in numbers, the Board continues to express its concern for registrations to be completed in a timely manner.

On a more positive note, Diving Queensland salutes all the Olympians and the results they achieved, and make particular mention of the Queenslanders - Sharleen Stratton, Ethan Warren and of course in her first Olympic Games outing, Silver Medallist Brittany Broben.

STATE GOVERNMENT

We are grateful for the assistance received from the Department Officers. Their advice and attention to our sport is most gratifying, and we enjoy a mutual respect for what is sometimes a difficult role.

We are completing the second year of the three year funding cycle.

With the State Government elections having such a massive result in favour of the non incumbents, there were several months of concern as to the new Government upholding the agreements with sport, that ensured funding would not be cut from the previously agreed amount. Such assurance has been provided, so Diving Queensland can plan appropriately in 2013 for whatever strategies the Government put into place for funding into the next cycle.

AVAILABLE GRANTS

With the new Government, all schemes were closed until policy changes could be understood and implemented. Slowly, new schemes are opening and all Clubs should ensure their awareness of the schemes available. The Gambling Community Benefit Fund is no doubt one of the best schemes for Clubs to apply for, along with several other State and Civic Government and private opportunities.

QUEENSLAND ACADEMY OF SPORT

QAS Diving is a partnership programme and is aimed at fast tracking the development of Queensland's young talented divers that demonstrate the potential to excel at an elite level.

Diving Queensland is very fortunate to have the backing of Diving Australia to ensure that the diving programme is maintained within the Queensland Academy of Sport.

MEMBERSHIP

As a primary KPI in the DQ Strategic Plan, many hours have been devoted to the Recreational Diving Programme. This is one of the most successful partnerships with the Brisbane City Council Chill Out scheme, and attendance is always at capacity.

Clubs need to embrace this concept while at the same time understand that while Diving Queensland continues with this strategy, that they the Clubs will

reap the rewards from any increased membership.

"GET ON BOARD"

The tag to rally all/any individuals into the fold, and to create a chance for divers to enjoy the art of springboard and platform diving, has been replicated in many ways, and should be used as frequently as possible. This obvious 'play-on-words' fits this organisation well.

CONCLUSION

Many thanks to our President Paul Stafford and the Board of Directors, for the role you play in this Association, and of course the commitment and dedication to that role.

To those who are not seeking re-election, your commitment is

known and appreciated - many thanks for all your efforts.

'Unsung heroes' are many in an organisation such as Diving Queensland. These people never get the public recognition they deserve, but they are well known and their contribution is recognised to the fullest extent.

COMPETITION DIRECTOR'S REPORT

Queensland has had a very successful year hosting three Qualifying Competition and three State Championships, (Age State, Elite Junior & Open).

Twenty four Queensland athletes attended the Age Nationals held in Adelaide in April this year. Queensland had great results with one Club, R.A.P.S Diving Club being awarded "Club of the Year", Alan Smith Head Coach winning "Coach of the Year" and 4 of their athletes were awarded "Diver of the Year" in their respective age Groups. The divers were Mary Holgate 16/18 yrs girls, Emily Scott 14/15 yrs girls, Michael Leonard 12/13 yrs boys and Sophie Johnson 11&U girls. PDC had four athletes attend this event, with Matt Skennar being awarded 16/18 yrs boys "Diver of the Year." Chandler Diving Club attended with five athletes.

Athletes from AIS, QAS, NTID, and Clubs represented Queensland at the Elite Junior Nationals held in Melbourne in July, with some outstanding results.

2012 was also an Olympic Year, in which Brittany Broben performed extremely well taking Silver in the individual Platform event, Sharleen Stratton placing 5th in the 3mtr individual event and Ethan Warren placing 7th on 3mtr.....fantastic results.

The World Junior Championships were held in Adelaide in October this year with outstanding results from Brittany Broben, James Connor and Emily Boyd. Queensland also had volunteer's working at this event.

In August Diving Queensland ran a Technical Workshop and Mock Competition, to encourage new Judges and Recording Secretaries. This was a very successful event and the Competition Committee suggesting Diving Queensland organise 2 of these events per year.

The Competition's Committee meets on a regular basis to improve Competition Rules these Rules can be found on the Diving Queensland Website.

Queensland now has a satisfactory level of judges at Level's 1-3. We still require a few more in the upper end of the scale. A few judges who are working hard towards this goal of course are attending to this and hopefully, they will soon be upgraded.

I would hope the current crop of Level 3 Judges will be able to attend Nationals for further assessments to be done, which will hopefully result in their Levels being moved to the upper end of the scale. I am looking forward to the level of judging in Queensland improving further, as we have made some positive improvements over the recent year.

RAPS DIVING CLUB REPORT

Also thanks to Paradise Diving Club for providing divers along with our own R.A.P.S divers, the displays were impressive.
